

**Question**

If  $c$  is a fixed positive constant, then

$$\frac{x^2}{\lambda^2} + \frac{y^2}{\lambda^2 - c^2} = 1 \quad c^2 < \lambda^2$$

defines a family of ellipses, any member of which is characterised by a particular value of  $\lambda$ . Show that every member of the family

$$\frac{x^2}{\mu^2} - \frac{y^2}{c^2 - \mu^2} = 1 \quad \mu^2 < c^2$$

intersects any member of the first family at right angles.

**Answer**

$$\frac{x^2}{a^2} + \frac{y^2}{b^2} = 1 \quad \text{gives} \quad \frac{dy}{dx} = -\frac{x}{y} \cdot \frac{b^2}{a^2}$$

$$\frac{x^2}{c^2} - \frac{y^2}{d^2} = 1 \quad \text{gives} \quad \frac{dy}{dx} = \frac{x}{y} \cdot \frac{d^2}{c^2}$$

So the product of slopes where a curve of each system intersects is

$$-\frac{x^2}{y^2} \cdot \frac{\lambda^2 - c^2}{\lambda^2} \cdot \frac{c^2 - \mu^2}{\mu^2}$$

where they intersect

$$-\frac{x^2}{\lambda^2} + \frac{y^2}{\lambda^2 - c^2} = 1 = \frac{x^2}{\mu^2} - \frac{y^2}{c^2 - \mu^2}$$

$$\text{So } \frac{x^2(\lambda^2 - c^2)(c^2 - \mu^2)}{y^2 \lambda^2 \mu^2} = 1$$

Thus the systems of curves are mutually orthogonal.

The foci are all at  $(\pm c, 0)$
